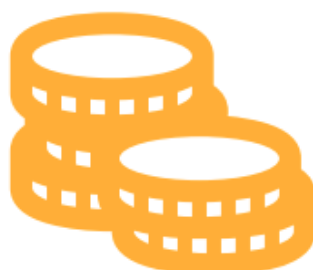


PANIC!: Call Out for Artist Bursaries (£5,000)



PANIC! invites artists to submit applications for £5,000 bursaries.

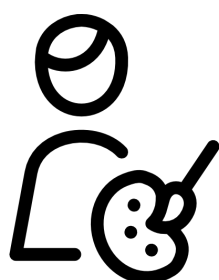
This means we use money



To pay artists to make new work



That everyone can enjoy, especially Artists.





Artists will work with The Tetley to deliver the artwork



Final Artworks will be presented online through The Tetley's website.



Bursaries are available to artists based in the [Leeds City Region](#).

We fund contemporary visual artwork in any media moving image, book, print, painting, sculpture, performance, sound, etc.



Brief:



'In our times... new, strange, dark, difficult, challenging, sad, interesting, unforeseen, unimagined...'



These artists will create new works that help us think through these new pandemic conditions.



Bursaries will create a voice to explore experiences, pressure and possibility.



Think about issues and experiences of race, class, gender, sexuality and disability.



Budget and Resources

The total budget is £5,000.



At least £1,500 of this budget should be spent on [fair artist fees \(click here\)](#).



£3,500 is for production, such as materials, equipment, travel, technicians and documentation.

10%

Selected artists can be **paid £4,500**, with the remaining 10% paid after delivery.



Bursary artists will work with The Tetley through an artist contract.



Marketing, staff support and a digital platform will be paid for separately by The Tetley.

How to Apply

You can send us your application in different ways. In writing, a video or audio recording.



Send us

1. A short statement about your practice (250 words)



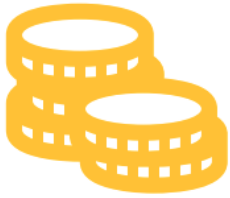
2. Why this PANIC! Bursary is important for your practice now? (200 words)



3. Proposal for a new artwork you would like to make for PANIC!

a) What would you like to do? (up to 250 words)

b) How does this artwork relate to the brief above? (250 words)



4. How would you like to spend the money? Share ideas of items you would want and their costs

5. A CV (maximum 2 pages of A4)



6. 6–10 images of previous work (or link to moving image work)



Fill in an anonymous equal opportunities monitoring form.

Proposals should be sent by email to programme@thetetley.org

The Deadline for proposals is **9am 12 November 2021**.



All artists will be informed of the final selection on **2 December 2021**.



Bursary Production: December - March

Online Presentation (online) : Week commencing 28 March



One final round will be available later in the year.

We offer optional feedback for unsuccessful applications, in the format you wish. These are based on areas of improvement from the criteria.



Selection Process

If we have everything we need from you, your application will be sent to five Steering Group members to review based on if your proposal;



- Responds to the brief of “In our times...”



- Creates a voice



- Engages with PANIC!'s aims, activity and supports a wider network of artists



- We prioritise artists who have not benefited

from significant projects or institutional opportunities.

- We are committed to, and have capacity to, support artists who are: disabled, learning disabled, with long-term health conditions, neurodivergent, LGBTQ+, asylum seekers, refugees, working class, Black and artists of colour and/or have not gone through formal art education.



Decisions will be made by discussion and consensus.
